

FM University - Red River Fishing; Opportunities In Our Own Back Yard

On July 28th the second in a series of youth education clinics was held at Dike East in Fargo. The clinic, conducted by members of FM Walleyes, focused on the fundamentals of catching fish right here in the Fargo/Moorhead area.

Fourteen children attended the event, which began with a series of learning stations focusing on river safety, baiting hooks, casting, river fishing rigs, netting fish, and fish identification and handling. After each child had attended all six stations the group made their way to the river bank for a fishing derby. A total of ten fish were caught including catfish, carp and goldeye. Prizes were awarded for the largest fish caught by a girl and by a boy. All who attended were given a certificate of completion.






Angler Young Angler Tournament Recap

The FM Walleyes Unlimited, Inc. and The Lake Region Anglers Association (LRAA) partnered their clubs resources to host the inaugural Devils Lake Regional AYA tournament on July 13th, 2008. Both club's Board of Directors saw the opportunity to meet one of their charter's primary guidelines to support youthful activities and expose youthful anglers to the wonderful sport of fishing. The clubs approached national AYA Director Michelle Trudeau and achieved authorization to move forward and be the host of the 1st Annual North Dakota Regional AYA Tournament event on Devils Lake. Barry Chouinard & Steve Garten accepted coordinator positions from the FM Walleyes and Keith Seidlinger accepted a similar position from Lake Region Anglers Association.

The objective of the AYA is to introduce and educate young anglers to competitive sport fishing in a fun filled team format. AYA started in 1998 when Tournament Founder Andrew Klopak, now the President of Lund Boats, decided he wanted to fish in a competitive style tournament with his son, and seeing no tournament like this he started his own. The first



AYA event was held on Lac Du Bonnet in Manitoba and from there it has evolved to 19 events held through-out the United States and Canada.

FM Walleyes and LRAA worked to generate interest among our two clubs for an event to be held on Devils Lake. The AYA event attracted 37 teams with 29 teams from North Dakota and 8 teams from Minnesota. The AYA Tournament event had one youthful member coming in to fish from Kentucky.

The weekend's events began with a formal rules meeting on Friday evening. It was determined to delay fishing until Sunday due to high winds. Saturday afternoon the teams met at Lakewood Park for a picnic and entertainment where Games Galore provided fun for the kids in a memorable afternoon. Sunday started early with boat inspections and valet parking. The teams were provided with live bait and a lunch to take with them for a day on the water. Devils Lake once again proved to be a wonderful fishery as all teams caught fish, with an average of over 4 fish per team.

Every participant involved in the event went away WINNERS with some \$19,000+ in prizes awarded to the anglers! The prizes included AYA Ryjus T-Shirts & Caps, Scheels, Berkley, & Rapala Rod and Reel Combos, Northland Fishing Tackle Tube It's & Jig packs, Fintech Jigs, Plano Tackle Boxes, Tempress FISH-ON! Boat Seats, collector AYA inscribed Eppinger Daredevils, Berkley and Northland plastic, Wally Diver Crankbaits, Rapala Pliers & Scales, Bait Fishing Tips Booklets and numerous other items. An AYA medallion was presented to each youthful angler in an Olympic style ceremony. A drawing was held to win a MotorGuide Electric Trolling Motor and an Eagle Fish Finder. Area fishing guides provided 7 different one day guided fishing trips. Plaques were awarded to the TOP 10, along with Big Fish Plaques and \$100 cash prize for both the boy and the girl who caught the largest walleye. AYA presented the CHAMPIONSHIP team a SPECIAL set of 1st Place AYA Trophies along with the Grand Prize consisting of a 12' Lund Boat, 4 HP Mercury Motor, and Shorelandr' trailer.

1st Place team Tom Backer, Shelby Backer and Mikalya Pusicala received \$500 to offset travel expenses and represent the North Dakota region as Champions. The AYA International Championship will be held on August 16th, 2008 at beautiful Lake of Woods, Kenora, Ontario. The 19 Regional champions will fish out of a fully wrapped AYA Lund Boat powered by a Mercury motor. The ultimate Grand Prize is a two tier Family Fantasy trip for 6. The first tier is a fly-in fishing outing to Miminiska Lodge at Thunder Bay, Ontario. The team will then fly Walt Disney World, Florida for the second tier.
