I then transferred to UND-Grand Forks and received a B.S. in Wildlife management.

In the past couple years I have also assisted the Williams and Burke County NRCS offices studying water quality of various watersheds in conjunction with the State Health Department. You can catch me doing just about anything at any lake on any given day during the summer months - from pounding signs, netting, repairing docks, to working on boat ramps. If it is at a lake in the northwest, you can bet I have done something with it.
