Dorgan pushes for Lake Oahe funding

U.S. Sen. Byron Dorgan's Energy and Water Subcommittee of the Senate Appropriations Committee has passed an amendment that would provide \$300,000 for Lake Oahe recreation upgrades.

The Senate will act on the entire appropriations bill in the next month, and the U.S. House of Representatives must adopt its own version of the funding bill. Then, the two versions go to a joint Senate-House Conference Committee to work out a compromise for final passage.

According to Sen. Dorgan, the \$300,000 will go to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, and the Corps will work with organizations and communities to determine how to allocate the money.

Projects in Emmons County that could be earmarked for some of the money are the Hazelton boat ramp and campground and low-water boat ramps, starting at the South Dakota border.

Any other uses for the funding would be determined by the Corps.
