In other words, plants and animals not native to our fishing waters threaten to damage or destroy the water or fishing quality of those waters if they are introduced. Unfortunately, most of the time, they are introduced by well meaning anglers traveling from one body of water to another in their pursuit of quality fishing. Most of the states east and south of us have numerous species that WE DON'T WANT IN NORTH DAKOTA! That means we have to be aware of what the dangers are and have to take steps to protect our waters. North Dakota now has rules and regulations to help prevent the spread of ANS with fines and penalties if we do not abide by them.

Lake Region Anglers Assoc. will regularly have articles in our newsletters and on our webpage regarding what you can do to help prevent this. LRAA will be regularly policing our outings. We have to watch ourselves, our friends, and fellow anglers and hunters and recreational boaters. To paraphrase, WE HAVE SEEN THE ENEMY AND IT IS WE. Only we can prevent the spread of Aquatic Nuisance Species, let us do it.

Enjoy your boating but keep your waters safe and secure. And by the way,


Membership Dues are Due

Devils Lake Angler Young Angler AYA

Walleyes Unlimited Inc. will be coordinating a new event on Devils Lake
that is titled Angler Young Angler
(AYA). The Devils Lake AYA event
will be one of 20 regional Angler
Young Angler Outings scheduled to
be held through-out the United
States and Canada in 2008. The
Angler Young Angler Outing has
strong support from many different
companies in the fishing industry
and from our two clubs who will be
hosting the Devils Lake event. The



objective of the Angler Young Angler Outings is to expose the youth of today to the great sport of competitive fishing within a fun family like atmosphere.

The Devils Lake Angler Young Angler Outing will be accepting 40 teams for entry with those teams competing for prizes provided by the National and Regional sponsors of the Angler Young Angler Outings. The format of a team for the Angler Young Angler Outings will consist of three (3) persons of which one (1) person must be an adult team member along with two (2) team members who are youthful anglers. The two (2) youthful anglers must be at the age of 17 or under on the date of the Devils Lake Regional event which will be held on Saturday July 12th, 2008. The entry fee for the Angler Young Angler Outing is \$150 with the first place prize for the Devils Lake Regional event consisting of a 12' Lund Boat, a 4 HP Mercury Outboard Motor, and a Shorelander Trailer. The first place team at each regional event will also earn the right to one of the qualifying spots for entry into the 3rd Annual North American Angler Young Angler Championship event that will be held on Saturday August 16th, 2008 on beautiful Lake of the Woods out of Kenora, Ontario.

Lynn Schlueter, Lake Region Anglers board member and Special Projects Biologist for the North Dakota Game and Fish Department were honored at the Game and Fish Departments annual winter meeting with the "Public Outreach" award for his efforts in the war against Aquatic Nuisance Species (ANS). Lynn chairs the Department's ANS Committee and spends countless hours traveling around the state giving presentations to local fishing, wildlife, sportsmen's organizations, fishing tournaments and water boards.

The Devils Lake Fisheries Office including Randy Hiltner, Phil Miller and Lynn Schlueter was also honored at the winter meeting with the "Solid Foundation" award for their efforts this past summer and fall in intensive efforts to monitor and eradicate Carp in the Billings Lake area, protecting the Devils Lake drainage from the introduction of this destructive species. This included daily trips to the area through almost all of the open water months, rain or shine including weekends.

ANNUAL MEETING

The North Dakota Sport fishing Congress (NDSFC) is the umbrella organization for

all the fishing clubs of North Dakota. NDSFC provides a unified voice for North Dakota anglers on sport fishing issues of statewide significance. NDSFC works closely with the ND Game and Fish, the State of ND Administration and Legislature, federal agencies such as the Corps or Engineers and the US Congressional Delegates. The NDFSC supports an independent lobbyist representing anglers at the State Legislature each biennium.

The NDSFC Annual Meeting and Fundraiser is in Mandan on April 12th at the Eagles Club. The Annual Board Meeting, free and open to the public, starting at 10AM where there will be presentations by Game and Fish, Corps of Engineers, Hatcheries, Fish and Wildlife, etc. This is one of the most informative sessions on the state of the fisheries in North Dakota you will ever attend.

The Fundraiser starts at 6PM and has a meal and hundreds of quality prizes. A fun event that supports the anglers of North Dakota. Tickets are \$25.00 and can be purchased through Clark Williams, 662-5008 or shadrap@gondtc.com or at the door.

Tips for the bored angler

Are you thinking of things to do on those dreary winter evenings. This is a great time to get your summer tackle in working condition and get rid of some of the winter blues. It is also a great time for getting that assorted tackle ready for the first trip of the year.

I usually start by getting a current inventory of specific types of baits and plastics so that I can buy them at close out sales or on introductory price. It is amazing the amount of money that you can save on early buys. Remember, later in the spring, there are 3.5 million anglers that are trying to get swivels, clips, bobbers, hooks, etc..... It is always better to start your shopping early.

Equipment maintenance is very important for success in the spring. I usually start the process of taking all my reels apart and checking the bales, drags and spools for defects and then oil and re-spool with the desired line, (remember most reels come with extra spools. This is a great time to have these prepared for quick replacement). Once reels are completed, I will check each rod blank and handles for cracks and make sure the guides are tight. This is also a great time to make sure that the reel and rod are a good match for lure weights and speed ratios.

Organization is the key to a fun trip on the water. I carry 20-30 trays of tack-le at any given time and have found that labels are a must for each tray, (do not mix and match lures) this only creates havoc when you are looking for that certain size lure and not just the color (please do not write in permanent marker on the trays as the contents usually change with new lures and discontinued baits) I use a labeler that makes a 1/2 inch wide label and is easy to change if needed.

Another great thing to do at this time is tie spinners. It is boring but the savings can be used for other purchases and on an average year, you may use 100 plus spinner rigs if you are a live baiter. Spinner storage is a pain at best, but there are several inexpensive solutions for this (swim noodles, large pipe insulation foam, just to name a few).

Safety items should be checked continually. This is a great time to go over life jackets, cushions, auxiliary horns, flashlights and things of this nature. It will be well received on the first trip. Make sure they are not torn and are in good working order.

Another thing that is positively important to me at this time is the updating of my electronics. Each brand of electronics has websites to download updates to the operating programs and mapping. This may be very valuable to your integrity of your unit and its ability to read newer mapping chips, as the formats are continually changing with little or no notice to the consumer.

Overall, being ahead of the game in the long, cold boring winter (if you are not an ice angler) will make your summer fishing experience a smoother adventure towards fun.
