Prez Sez: Enough is enough

Just when we thought it couldn't get wetter- guess what? When you're a fisherman your activities focus on water, but enough is enough. Devils Lake's 3 ft rise last year pressured state and federal agencies to move quickly ahead with plans to raise highways and dikes. This summer promises to be another train wreck for roads around Devils Lake, including many of those going to lake accesses.

Now guess what- the lake's coming up again! Right now, predictions are that water levels will jump at least three more feet. And if we get more snow or have a rainy spring, who knows? Consequently, fishermen should be aware that after the challenge of getting to some ramps, getting to favorite fishing spots may be difficult and even dangerous. We lost the north ramp at Minnewaukan last summer and dike work has

closed Henegar's Landing for the season. Only because ND Game and Fish and Grahams Island State Park people were on their toes last spring were we able to save the East Bay, 6 Mile Bay and Black Tiger Access facilities. If the lake comes up ONLY the projected three feet those ramps should still be useable, but reconstruction of parts of Hwy 19, Hwy 20, Hwy 57 and Woods-Rutten Road will also complicate getting there in the first place.

And don't forget- higher water means boating under bridges, especially at Hwy 57 and Woods-Rutten Road, is going to get even chancier, especially with wave action from west and northwest winds. With the promised 3 foot rise, boats with windshields may not be able to make it under these bridges at all. Pelican, East Devils Lake, Mission Bay and the north end of 6 Mile may soon be in inaccessible by water. There are no plans to raise the bridges when the highways are raised, so we'll have to find other solutions. Lake Region Anglers is continuing to work with other agencies to help find those solutions, but they

won't be easy, they won't be quick and they won't be cheap.

The road to Graham's Island from Hwy 19 is in danger of going under. We can't afford to lose this important access. The last time the road was threatened NDDOT did not plan on raising it, but Senator Dorgan found the money to get it done. If NDDOT decides to let the road go again, the most heavily used North Dakota State Park and most heavily used access facility on Devils Lake will be an island again.

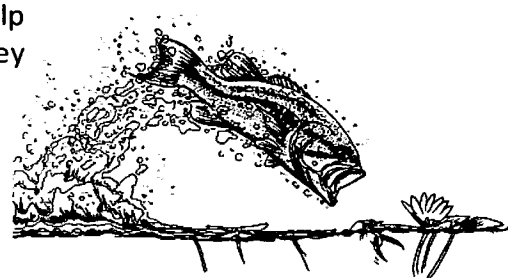
On a positive note, Game and Fish says the Devils Lake walleye population is at a record high. The fish are healthy and plentiful. Perch fishing has picked up. The northern and white bass jump in your boat when you look for them (and even when you don't.) Fishing should be great again this year, but be ready for some hassles getting there and getting used to more new water changing favorite fishing spots. Spring only looks far off; but it'll be ice-out before we know it. GOOD FISHIN'. I'll see you at the Annual Meeting March 19 at Devils Lake KC's.

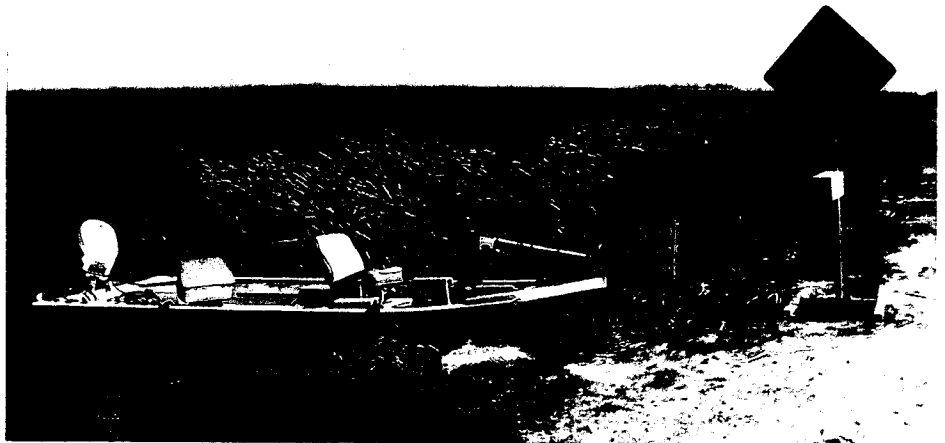
Election of Officers

Summer access & boat ramps



The boat ramp situation, let alone getting to them in the first place, will only worsen with rising lake levels and dike construction. It's a bigger challenge every year to keep what we already have open, accessible and safe. Let's not even talk about navigating under bridges, especially on windy days, for those of us with tall boats and/or windshields. Many of you will remember frantically removing windshields to get under the Hwy 57 weir in the eighties. And the North Dakota Department of Transportation has no plans to raise bridges when they raise the roads again.

LRAA and the Game and Fish Department have been turning over options to deal with these problems, but are hampered by the unpredictability of the lake rise. Suitable locations for new ramps are extremely few to nonexistent because most shoreline areas of Devils Lake have too shallow a slope to accommodate the drop needed to, well, drop in your boat. Not to mention that the few sites that might meet the criteria are too far from good roads to make them feasible.

Pelican Lake: We have been looking at options to construct a ramp and access facility on Pelican Lake for four years and don't seem any closer now than when we started. We've researched a number of locations and situations, including using the old Hwy 281 roadbed as a base. Every site we've considered comes with its own complex set of problems, including huge costs, getting Federal approvals, and dealing with the unknown consequences of rising water. We will continue to work on a solution but don't expect anything in 2010.

Lake Irvine: We have submitted a proposal to Game and Fish for a small access out of Churches Ferry onto Lake Irvine. Construction is contingent upon final lake levels. If the lake comes up the projected three feet, this site will be under water. We will send out updated info in Spring, when we know where things stand. Watch your newsletters, email and check our webpage.

East Devils Lake: We have no plans to develop an access on East Devils Lake at present but are looking at possible sites for the future. If the lake climbs the projected three feet, passing under the Woods-Rutten Bridge will become questionable for boats with a windshield or when a west wind pushes up swells. If members have any suggestions or possible solutions contact a Board Member or send an email to LRAA@gondtc.com.

Henegar Landing: Due to dike construction, this facility will be closed and the cleaning station unusable for the foreseeable future. Plans are to rebuild the ramp and the cleaning station will remain where it is now.

One poorly planned trip and Zebra Mussels are here

The discovery of zebra mussels in Pelican Lake, Minnesota is a real concern to North Dakota anglers. Pelican Lake is a popular fishery for many eastern North Dakotans and Minnesotans. Many of the Pelican anglers are the same ones who will travel to fish other North Dakota walleye waters such as the Missouri River and Devils Lake. And let us not forget that some anglers fish the Red River for catfish and then travel east across the state in search of other fish species.

With this aquatic nuisance species at our door, the movement of zebra mussels into North Dakota must be prevented. It takes doing the ANS inspection each time you leave a water body, not planning on doing it when you have time.

Once a water body is infested, the aquatic nuisance species overwhelm the underwater

habitats, leading to fewer desirable fish. Stocking huge number of fingerlings will not overcome the problems caused by ANS, either. Keeping the ANS out of our waters to begin with is the only solution.

ANS prevention is for all anglers, hunters, boaters and personal watercraft users. New ANS prevention regulations are in place. We all need to:

Inspect and remove all aquatic vegetation from boats, personal watercraft, trailers, and associated equipment such as fishing poles and lures before leaving a water body.

Remove all aquatic vegetation from bait containers when leaving the water.

Drain all water from boats and other watercraft, including bilges, livewells and motors, at the ramp site before leaving a water body. Haul baitfish in a small volume of

water.

Do not transport live aquatic bait or aquatic vegetation into North Dakota. All water must be drained from watercraft upon entering the state.

Do not dump unused bait into any North Dakota water.

Do not introduce any fish into North Dakota waters.

If ANS prevention is ignored, we stand the risk of losing the fishing in North Dakota that we currently enjoy.
